
October 2020 Crossword Puzzle

Hugh Monroe Farmer

November 17, 1926 – July 31, 2018

Hugh Monroe Farmer, 91, of Bartlesville, passed away July 31, 2018, in Bartlesville, Oklahoma. Hugh was born November 17, 1926 in Amarillo, Texas to Otto Monroe and Irene Bell Farmer. He graduated from the University of Texas with a Bachelor's and Master's Degree in Civil Engineering. Hugh was a Korean War Veteran, retired as a Lieutenant Colonel from the United States Army Reserves. He worked for many years with the U.S. government in the Economic Development Administration in Austin, Texas, and eventually became the Under Secretary for the Department of Congress in Washington D.C. After retiring, Hugh was active in his community of Lago Vista, Texas, serving as a City Councilman for 16 years, and then became a Judge. He was very active as a deacon at the Travis Oaks Baptist church in Lago Vista. He was a kind and loving husband and Father.

Hugh is survived by his Wife; Glenna Farmer of the home, 2 sons; Scott and his wife Grace Farmer of Bartlesville, and Randy Farmer of Houston, Texas, 3 grandchildren; Jeff, Jonathan, and Ben, 2 great grandchildren; Owen and Ian. He was preceded in death by his parents; Otto Monroe and Irene Farmer.

Brother Farmer was initiated as an Entered Apprentice on February 9, 1954, Passed to the Degree of Fellow Craft on March 16, 1954 and Raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason on April 27, 1954 at Hill City Lodge No. 456 A.F. & A. M. in Austin Texas. On August 16, 2016 Brother Farmer received his Grand Lodge 50 Year Service Award by the Grand Lodge of Texas from his Home Lodge, Hill City Lodge No. 456 A.F. & A. M.. Brother Hugh Monroe Farmer was a dedicated Mason for over 51 years.

And so it has come to pass, a Brother Master Mason having completed all the design's laid down on the Trestleboard of Life, has answered the summons of the Grand Warden of Heaven and Earth and has entered into the Grand Lodge over which the Supreme Grand Master of the Universe presides.

Obituary

Hello Brothers,

Seeing as we are in an election year I thought I would talk a little about one of the major ways freemasonry has influenced American politics. This story starts back in September 1826 with a man named William Morgan. Morgan claimed to be raised to a Master Mason when he was living in Canada. During Morgan's time living outside of the States, he attempted to visit and help establish lodges in Batavia unsuccessfully. The members of those lodges denied him entry on the grounds that they questioned his claim to be a Masonic member although no one actually knows if Morgan was a Brother or not to this day. This upset Morgan to the point where he decided to write a book exposing some Masonic secrets and drag the reputation of Freemasonry through the mud. William Morgan collaborated with a newspaper writer and announced his intention to release a book exposing Freemasonry's secrets.

The announcement stirred a lot of controversy between lodges in the surrounding areas. He was arrested on September 8th for owing a debt of \$2.65. Two days later he was abducted from his jail cell and was never seen again. Rumors swarmed that he was abducted by a New York Lodge of Freemasons and was murdered. Some think that the disappearance was staged in order to sell more copies of the book.

The news of Morgan's disappearance spread through the states and created mass hysteria all over the US. Several lodges closed because of this and mass opposition to Masonry started to erupt. The opposition eventually coalesced into a political party and the rise of Americans first ever 3rd party, the Anti-Masonic Party. The Anti-Masonic party was establish as a single issue party which organized themselves around one unifying issue.

During John Quincy Adams' Presidency, there was a period of political realignment. The Anti-Masons emerged as an important third-party alternative to Andrew Jackson's Democrats and Adam's National Republicans. The party later progressed into a political force by adopting other issues on which to run. Eventually most of the party members ended up leaving the party and joining the Whig Party. In 1831, the Anti-Masonic party held the first ever Presidential nominating convention, a practice that was subsequently adopted by all major parties.

Though the movement was against Freemasonry, the craft still changed the course of American political history that we can still see today. What history will the craft write for the future?
