Hiram I of Tyre. The word Hiram might be translated as "my brother is exalted". He was a Phoenician king that reigned 969-936 BC. He supplied King Solomon with men and materials for the construction of the Temple in Jerusalem. He also cooperated with King Solomon in Red Sea and Mediterranean trading voyages. They went to Ophir which is thought to be either East Africa or India.. In return King Solomon gave King Hiram some small towns and tribute. I remember reading that King Hiram was not happy with the towns given to him because they were so poor. So, among friends there can be some disagreements. The city of Tyre is on the Mediterranean coast of what is now Southern Lebanon. It is one of the oldest continually inhabited cities in the world.

But as Master Masons we are also familiar with the name Hiram Abiff or Abif. And we know what happened to him. He was the son of a widow. He had the skills to work with many different materials. He was the master craftsman in the building of the first Temple. Abif is a Hebrew word meaning "his father" and has become a title of honor.

Volunteer

Most of you know that I can be pretty energetic when it comes to ideas for Lodge activity and organizing. And, yes, sometimes a little much to deal with. Hopefully, you all understand that it is with the best of intentions for the Lodge and the Brethren and are not offended. When socializing some idea or project I have, I have sometimes heard that I should remember that our Lodge is a "volunteer organization" as contrasted from businesses or other entities more likely to be successful in requiring action and/or compliance. As I have wondered that guidance for some time, I also remembered that another genuine volunteer organization is the U.S. Marine Corps, but they manage to accomplish a great deal based on their manner of engagement and bonding.

Now our Brethren are not about to gear up and go into battle and many Brothers deliver about the right amount of volunteer effort just by paying their dues and showing for meetings. However, there is another level of voluntary effort that comes with the Brother's choice to join the line of officers, committees, degree teams and the occasional one-off request from the Worshipful Master. While each Mason's cabletow is still in effect, it is important that the Brother carefully consider his own commitment before agreeing to take on such heightened responsibility, or to step up with a new idea for voluntary endeavor.

Remembering the working tool of a Master Mason, there should be no contentions and effort in the Lodge is NOT a competition. I remind myself frequently of the something occasionally seen in that profoundly source of wisdom – Facebook. Well the Freemason groups anyway. My goal isn't to be better than others. My goal is to be better than I once was.

With that in mind, I have voluntarily taken on the biggest challenge of my Masonic career in describing and proposing a Strategic Planning and Operations Committee for our Lodge which is starting to move forward. To make the decision about this, I had to carefully examine my motives for doing this. My "why". Here is what I have honestly and earnestly documented.

I love everything about Freemasonry – its vastness of symbolic knowledge, its tried and proven strength to survive organizational and human frailty, its unending and fundamental pursuit of truth and light, the way its principles, tenets and lessons get proven to be correct continuously, and even how the occasional challenges and frustrations teach us to be bigger and better men.

I consider Freemasonry to be so very important at this time to the support and recovery of the best vision and ideals of this nation, as the "shining city upon a hill". Those needed tenets are morality, leadership, freedom, prosperity, faith and trust in God, human development, equality and unity, and earnest striving for strength and success in all things.

We have tremendous momentum in shrinkage of numbers and declining enthusiasm for, and commitment to, our craft that MUST be reversed.

It is most likely that many good men and their circles of interest want, but probably have trouble finding, an environment in which to learn and develop along the lines that Freemasonry can provide. Working in this structured way we can improve on this significantly.

It is in my nature to be a look-out, a fixer, an innovator and a fire-starter.

I have prayed about this and know that I must do it and convert or ignore all naysayers.

That's my story and I'm sticking to it. Join me if you will and to the degree you choose. I am clear in my intent and vision and am determined to make it work for the benefit, strength and growth of the Lodge.

The Grand Lodge of Texas' Officer Leadership Training (OLT) always covered and stressed the importance of Administration, Law, Planning and Communication in running a Lodge. While every Texas Lodge has been doing this things to some degree, my reading between the lines of this 16-hour firehose-drinking immersive course led me to the point that we could do better with some attention to two areas of perspective and practice with which I am familiar - sustainability and operationalizing. I'm not saying that the traditional topics of OLT are any less important, just that they are strengthened in practice by applying some principles borrowed from experience in business and organizations. So I am offering for the approval of the Worshipful Master and the Lodge an organized set of ideas that I am confident will strengthen and grow the Lodge and enhance the experience for seasoned Masons in the line of officers, new Masons who are observing what the Lodge is about, and all the Brethren of the Lodge.

What I am proposing to do will be seen, to some degree, as breaking from some traditions or historically-observed patterns of organic behavior in the Lodge. I promise that every bit of it is not meant to be disrespectful but to serve, strengthen and grow the Lodge. Some will understand this immediately upon reading the material I will be sharing, first with the officers and later with the Lodge as a whole. Others may take a while to understand this fully and be convinced. Hopefully quite soon all the officers, working better as a team, will demonstrate what this is about. As Brother Richard Schlaudroff, Vice Chairman of the GL Committee on Masonic Education and Service, emphasized at OLT, "Do not fear change. Fear the inability to change."

In a nutshell, the proposal will be to form a Strategic Planning and Operating Committee in which the elected officers and those coming behind them back to the Senior Steward would work as a team to document how the Lodge operates; train and develop the line of officers; build, revise and maintain a 5-year Strategic plan; and communicate regularly about needs to be done – and CAN be done – in the Lodge, both now and for the ensuing five years. The benefits to the Lodge are a stronger operating team, more accomplishments on an ongoing basis, less stress with fewer things falling between the cracks or waiting until the last minute and MORE FUN. All of this will move through a review, revision and approval process and ultimately be shared with the whole Lodge.
