

## **Obituary**

#### From the South

#### John A. Murphy

Brother John A. Murphy of Austin Texas passed peacefully on June 9th, 2019 at 7PM, 2 months shy of his 91st birthday. John was born in Minneapolis Minnesota and served proudly in the US Marines. Jack moved to Texas in 1956 first settling in Dallas and then moving to Austin in 1982. Jack was a successful business man and created several businesses including Jack Murphy & Company and American Physicians Group; he was a member of The Young Presidents Organization as well as The World Presidents Organization. Jack was a lifelong Mason and a member of the Hella Shrine. He marched in many parades playing his beloved trumpet for the Hella band; he was an accomplished pilot flying himself, his family and friends around the country. Jack loved golf and played regularly well into his 80's. Jack is survived by his loving wife of 49 years, Judie Woods Murphy, his children, Mari Jo Marriott, John Murphy, Susan Sussee and Michael Murphy, 7 Grandchildren, and 5 Great Grandchildren. Jack is preceded in death by his mother, Helen Brown McClure, Father Arthur Murphy and Sister Patricia Horne. The family is holding a private vigilance celebrating the life of Jack.

Brother Carr was initiated as an Entered Apprentice on March 13, 1953, Passed to the Degree of Fellow Craft on April 10, 1953, and Raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason on May 22, 1953 at Ludwig Lodge No. 311 A.F. & A. M. in St. Paul, Minnesota.

In August of 1989, Brother Murphy affiliated with Hill City Lodge No. 456 in Austin, Texas. He received his 50 year service award on October 25. 2007 and his 60 year service award on October 10, 2012, both at Hill City Lodge No. 456 A.F. & A. M.

And so it has come to pass, a Brother Master Mason having completed all the design's laid down on the Trestleboard of Life, has answered the summons of the Grand Warden of Heaven and Earth and has entered into the Grand Lodge over which the Supreme Grand Master of the Universe presides.

# DID YOU KNOW THE NAZIS USED THE FORGET ME NOT FLOWER PIN

We all have heard the story of Masons in Germany wearing the Forget Me Not flower pin in their lapel to identify themselves as Mason's during the Nazi regime. Hitler came to power in 1933. And in 1934 the German Ministry of the Interior ordered the disbandment all Masonic lodges and their property confiscated. Somewhere between 50,000 to over 200,000 German Masons were put in internment camps and some killed.

In 1926, before the takeover by the Nazis, the German Masonic Grand Lodge of the Sun had an annual meeting and gave each masonic member a small Forget Me Not flower pin. This pin was produced in a small factory in the town of Selb. This was probably the first time Masons had worn the Forget Me Not.

But did you know that the Nazi party used the same Forget-Me-Not pin.

After Hitler came to power he established a program called Winterhilfswerk or Winter Help Work. Donations to this program were supposedly voluntarily given. But a great amount of pressure was applied to citizens to donate to this program. You could even be stopped on the streets if you didn't have a pin in your lapel showing that you had made a contribution. This pin was occasionally changed to a different pin to enforce further contributions. The collected funds were used to help the distressed population, but was also used for arms production for Germany.

The Nazis needed a new and different pen for the 1938 winter help program. They selected the same factory the Masons had used in the town of Selb. The factory made the same Forget Me Not pin for the Nazi party that the Masons had ordered in 1926.

After the war, in 1948, a masonic lodge was reestablished in the town of Selb. The worshipful master orde red a number of forget-me-not pins and handed them out. He later became Grandmaster.

Some of us are old enough to remember Paul Harvey, the radio commentator. He would have said, "And now you know the rest of the story."
