

Masonic Education!

The Soul

As soon as I mention the soul, almost all Masons will tell me that it will "Never, ever, ever die." But here's a question. What are you doing with yours today?

Many Masons, including myself, think of the soul as a tiny slice of God, the Supreme Architect of the Universe. Along those lines, the soul could be said to contain certain characteristics in unlimited capacity – imagination, strength of will, peace, wisdom, gratitude, trust and most certainly love, among others. It is only the human aspects in which the soul is intertwined that, to some degree, limit us and tarnish or distort those limitless parts of our souls. Many symbolic lessons in Masonry focus on the ways in which the heavenly elements connect with the earthly or human domain which should make us think about how we manage that interplay in our minds, within and around our own soul. Two stories come to mind that provide some guidance on this.

Many have heard the story of the Native American speaking to his young grandson about two wolves that live within our spirits. One is a strong leader and provider serving his pack. The other is a cruel conniver, attacking the weak and taking care only of himself. When the young boy asks "Which one survives?" the old man says "The one you feed".

Another theme sometimes discussed around the founders of start-up companies talks about the critical necessity of knowing and cultivating the soul of the company. In that lesson, the soul of a company is described as having two parts – heart and vision. Heart is the passion and purpose of the company and the values that guide the operation, while the vision is the identification of a goal and the definition of steps by which to reach it. Of course, that soul of a company is not the same as the human soul given by God, but there are parallels. Much of Masonic teaching sets forth the values we inculcate in our Masonic edifice and purposes for our actions. Perhaps the vision part of our soul is to be developed by each Mason for himself, derived from those values, and from the wages earned by the exercise or the craft and by the experiencing of the fraternity.

So we ask, do you spend time consciously developing the vision, values and practices of your soul as a Mason? Do you have an inner sense of where that Masonic goal is for you and how to get there?

Do you spend more time feeding the good wolf than the bad wolf?

Many years ago I was told that prayer is how we tend and cultivate our soul in concert with God. Do you pray for things and conditions of the earthly world or for

Obituary

George Warren Botbyl

The family pillar and loving father George Warren Botbyl, 88, has gone to be with his Lord and Savior in heaven. He journeyed upward in the arms of loving angels on Friday, December 20, 2019. George was born to Marjorie and George in Glen Ridge, NJ, and is survived by his four children and their families, Gregory and Karen Botbyl, Katherine and William St. Jean, Linda Branham and Tim Kihnel, and Douglas Botbyl. He was an excellent grandfather to his nine grandchildren: Jacqueline, Jeremiah, Andrew, Jeffrey, Joshua, Kimberly, John-Michael, Bridget, Trent, and four great grandchildren: Asha, Aiden, Tabitha, and Cooper. Also survived by his younger brother Allan and his wife Joan.

George graduated from the United States Naval Academy and was commissioned as a second lieutenant in the U.S. Air Force to become a pilot and see the world. During pilot training he met and married his Texas sweetheart Billie Lee Moeser who helped raise the children and complemented his 30 years of service. Retiring from the Air Force they returned to their residence in Austin, Texas where George continued his professional career as a professor at The University of Texas Center of Space Research.

Upon final retirement they enjoyed traveling to visit their children and grandchildren across the country, while George stayed active in financial planning, walking with his many close friends, and socializing with his coffee group.

He will be missed by family and friends for his encouragement, guidance, and as a positive role model to all.

Brother Johnson was initiated as an Entered Apprentice on November 27, 1956, Passed to the Degree of Fellow Craft on March 30, 1957 and Raised to the Sublime Degree of a Master Mason on June 4, 1957 in New Jersey. Brother Botbyl affiliated with Hill City Lodge No. 456 A.F. & A. M. in Austin, Texas on June 3, 1986. He received his 50 year service award on November 14, 2006 and his 60 Year Service Award on August 16, 2016 by the Grand Lodge of Texas at Hill City Lodge No. 456.

And so it has come to pass, a Brother Master Mason having completed all the design's laid down on the Trestleboard of Life, has answered the summons of the Grand Warden of Heaven and Earth and has entered into the Grand Lodge over which the Supreme Grand Master of the Universe presides.

Hello Brothers.

Have you ever sat in a Hill City Lodge stated meeting, looked to the Southwest corner, and wondered who is that good looking man? No, I'm not talking about Brother Oscar Orum. talking about the other distinguished-looking man in the stained glass picture. He looks so handsome and well-dressed and has a great mustache. That man is Samuel P. Cochran. He was born In 1855 in Lexington Kentucky and graduated as valedictorian of his high school class in 1873. (There is also a bronze statue of him on the lawn at the Scottish Rite Cathedral in Dallas.) His first church affiliation was the Presbyterian Church and then later he was in the Christian Science Church in Dallas. He chose the business of insurance for his career but also earned a law degree and again was valedictorian of his class. Outside of his business interest he devoted much of his time to Freemasonry.

Brother Cochran became a Freemason in 1880. He was instrumental in organizing the Dallas Scottish Rite Cathedral, the Home for Aged Masons in Dallas and the Texas Scottish Rite Hospital for crippled children. He was Grand Master of Texas Masons. He received honors in many different organizations such as Order of the Eastern Star, DeMolays, Shriners, York Rite, and the Royal Order of Scotland. He was responsible for establishing the Scottish Rite dormitory at the University of Texas. (Brother Ralph Wayne is now the supervisor of the Scottish Rite dormitory.)

Every time I look at his stained glass picture I wonder how one man accomplished so much. I will never be able to contribute to our Brotherhood as much as this man has done. Maybe each one of us can do one more project for the fraternity we cherish. It is maybe as small as a phone call to a Brother who needs to hear a caring voice. Or it might be something that will affect our brothers after we are gone.

Do just one more good deed.
